

#### Walter Gerlach Stock Show History

- **1972** The three John Marshall FFA Bexar County Directors present a motion that Bexar County include a sale in conjunction with the Bexar County Livestock Show. The motion was denied. The John Marshall FFA Booster Club votes to start the John Marshall FFA Show and Sale. The sale will provide the opportunity for students to sell their animal projects. Walter Gerlach agrees to allow the John Marshall FFA Booster Club to use the land, located 3 miles outside 1604 on Babcock Road, near the Helotes Little League Park. Mr. Calvin Galm contacts Mr. Vickery and donates four old chicken barns to be used in the construction of the show barn.
- **1973** Construction is started on the John Marshall FFA Show Barns. Mr. Vickery originates the **"Workday"**. "Workdays" become an every weekend event as plans are made for the 1<sup>st</sup> Show. Dee Dee Saathoff and Doris Young visit Wilbur Bradford, President of Security Nat'l Bank located at the corner of St. Cloud and Bandera Road. They receive the 1<sup>st</sup> donation to the 1974 auction in the amount of \$100. Parents, students and teachers disassemble the donated chicken barns. The corrugated tin from the chicken barns is used to cover the arena and livestock barns. The Swine barns are still covered by the corrugated tin. Tesoro Oil Company (Mr. Bill Knaggs) donates drill stem pipe to the J.M. FFA show. The pipe was used and still exists as the main supports for the arena and livestock barns.

- **1974** The John Marshall Agriculture Department Teachers C.E. Vickery, Robert Keaton, John Vasbinder and Joey Tomlinson supervise student exhibits at the 1<sup>st</sup> JM FFA Livestock Show. There was less than \$400 in the Show's bank account. The water line was completed the night before the show opened. Grand Champion Steer is bought by an unauthorized buyer and later sold to the McDonough Brothers for \$2,000. This has been the only time that a Grand Champion was sold twice. Total Sale of Auctioned Animals \$43,367.
- 1975 New Concession stand (aka: Gerlach Grill) and Restrooms are constructed. Total Sale of Auctioned Animals \$71,293
- **1976** Total Sale of Auctioned Animals \$80,122
- 1977 Total Sale of Auctioned Animals \$91,204
- 1978 Total Sale of Auctioned Animals \$104,221
- 1979 Total Sale of Auctioned Animals \$119,508
- 1980 Last Chance Lot is introduced and Market Turkeys are added to the show. Total Sale of Auctioned Animals \$153,000
- **1981** The NISD opens a new Agriculture Program at O.W. Holmes High School. Holmes FFA students, under the supervision of Ag teacher Joey Tomlinson, exhibit at the show for the first time. Total Sale of Auctioned Animals \$196,637
- 1982 Total Sale of Auctioned Animals \$198,534
- 1983 The name of the show is changed from the John Marshall FFA Show & Sale to Walter Gerlach Greater Northwest Livestock Show & Sale. Total Sale of Auctioned Animals \$202,000
- 1984 Mr. C. E. Vickery retires. Total Sale of Auctioned Animals \$205,312
- **1985** Total Sale of Auctioned Animals \$179,412
- 1986 Total Sale of Auctioned Animals \$182,501
- **1987** Total Sale of Auctioned Animals \$167,541
- **1988** Total Sale of Auctioned Animals \$163,412
- 1989 Total Sale of Auctioned Animals \$187,565
- **1990** Total Sale of Auctioned Animals \$164,512
- 1991 In an effort to allow more students to participate in the showing of Steers, the WGLS Board of Directors initiates a Commercial Steer Show. Total Sale of Auctioned Animals \$169,304
- **1992** Total Sale of Auctioned Animals \$176,891
- 1993 Sand is removed and arena is paved. Total Sale of Auctioned Animals \$179,431
- **1994** The buyers reception/office building is completed. Total Sale of Auctioned Animals \$206,831
- 1995 Total Sale of Auctioned Animals \$221,546
- 1996 The main arena is extended. Total Sale of Auctioned Animals \$269,412
- 1997 Total Sale of Auctioned Animals \$293,200
- 1998 The NISD combines the John Marshall and O.W. Holmes Agriculture Departments into a single Ag. Program at the newest high school, Sandra Day O'Connor. The teachers Steve Chumbley, John Vasbinder, Mike Tondre and Joey Tomlinson supervise the 1<sup>st</sup> exhibits entered under S.D. O'Connor FFA. Total Sale of Auctioned Animals - \$341,800
- 1999 Total Sale of Auctioned Animals \$381,000
- 2000 Total Sale of Auctioned Animals \$468,000
- 2001 Total Sale of Auctioned Animals \$444,000

- 2003 Market Goats are added to the show. Total Sale of Auctioned Animals \$464,250

- 2007 The Show Barn property is purchased by the Walter Gerlach Stock Show Association. Mr. Gerlach and children had let the show use the property for a total of 36 years. Total Sale of Auctioned Animals \$565,000
- 2008 Extended paving and major drainage renovation. Total Sale of Auctioned Animals \$614,212
- 2009 The Board of Directors established two divisions within the Market Lambs, Goats and Swine. The directors, being aware of the high price of show animals, feed and care, wanted to encourage exhibitors' participation. They made the decision that the show would purchase market animals in a group from well know breeders. Group purchases would allow the students to purchase, raise and exhibit a market animal at a more economical price. The directors also wanted to make sure that students and parents who desired to purchase their own show animals, from any breeder, would have the ability to exhibit at the WGLS. The rules were approved. There would be a Commercial Division (group purchase) and Open Division (individual purchase). The Champion from each division would show against each other with the Grand Champion determined by the Judge. Total Sale of Auctioned Animals \$585,000
- 2010 The first year commercial animals are exhibited in the Lamb, Goat and Swine division. Outside Cattle Wash Rack is converted into a Directors Office. Total Sale of Auctioned Animals \$558,000



Exhibitors, parents and buyers of the Show and Sale need to be aware that nearly \$12.0 million has been raised on the sale of projects since 1974, the year of the first Show and Sale. The Walter Gerlach Show and Sale would not have been possible without the dedication, leadership and hard work of Mr. Vickery. His vision of a show and sale started in 1972, when he was able to motivate students, parents, business leaders and NISD School Officials. In 1974, the show and sale became a reality. Following his retirement, the show directors created the C. E. Vickery Award in 1986. This award recognizes exhibitors who demonstrate the characteristics of leadership, integrity, work ethic and a commitment to the show and its exhibitors. From the

show's beginning, Mr. Vickery stated, "As long as the people (parents and students) want it, it will happen". Also, another quote from Mr. Vickery, "the best little show in Texas". There is another saying that applies to Mr. Vickery, "We Will Not Forget".

#### **History of Last Chance Lots**

From its start in 1974, the Show and Sale has continued to grow, with more Exhibitors, more Sale Lots and more Buyers, all which increased the operating expenses. The Board of Directors made the decision that, rather than raise additional funds from the exhibitors, they would add a Last Chance Lot. What a success. The first "Last Chance Lot" in 1980 was the sale of a "Cabrito", a small Spanish Goat used for meat purposes. It set a World Champion Record price of \$4,000. The cabrito was purchased by McDonough Brothers Inc., Raba-Kistner Consultants, Health/Stitch and Alamo Cement. Throughout the years, the Last Chance Lot has included the sale of a donkey, pot bellied pigs, peacocks, trips, gift baskets, and model tractors. The total raised by the "Last Chance Lot" through 2012 is \$348,174. The Walter Gerlach Livestock Show & Sale thanks the buyers and individuals that continue to donate and have made the Last Chance Lot such a success.

#### New FFA Showbarn to Make Debut

John Marshall High Future Farmers of America members will stage their first livestock show and sale Friday and dairy entries, poultry and rabbits. Saturday. All the activities will be at the chapter's new show barn on Babcock Rd 3.2 miles north of Loop 1604.

The buildings in the complex have been built by student and volunteer labor. Many of the materials for the buildings have been donated.

Charles Vickery, vocational agriculture teacher at the school, said he believed this will be the first FFA auction since the opening of the Freeman Coliseum.

Judging will start Friday morning and continue Sa truday morning. The auction sale will be at 3 p.m.

The entry list includes 51 steers, 80 hogs, 50 sheep,

The show also will have entries from 4-H Club members who attend school in the Northside Independent School District.

Members of the FFA Booster Club explained the auction was adopted because of the tremendous competition in the show and sale of the major shows of Texas.

They also pointed out that the energy crisis might keep many of the students from traveling with their entries. Profits from the show will be used for student agriculture programs.

The silver anniversary edition of the Walter Gerlach Greater Northwest Livestock Show and Sale opens today with poultry judging and continues through Saturday when the Auction of Champions will be held.

More than 350 entries are expected to participate in the four-day event at Walter Gerlach Park, located on Babcock Rd., three miles north of Loop 1604.

This year's show is dedicated to C.E. Vickery, former John Marshall High School agriculture teacher who formed the FFA Booster Club and was Instrumental In the development of the Gerlach Livestock Show.

Under Vickery, Marshall's agriculture department received state and national recognition for its programs.
